porting a crime, stalking, strangulation, and violations of protective orders. The units goals include follow up on family related crimes including locating and tracing suspects and following up on warrants. They interview people involved in the case as either the victim or the suspect

and help connect the victims with the service the victim may need. The unit processes the crime scenes and works with the prosecutors to prosecute the cases.

Detective Miller presented local facts and statistics from 2007, 2008, and 2009 for the types of crimes that are being committed. Some interesting trends were no-

ticed, such as a decline in over all instances of domestic crimes with women as the victim or arrestee, and with the male as the arrestee, but a rise in the number of male victims. This trend can be due to several

factors including a culture that is starting to recognize males can be victimized by both men and women. Detective Miller provided many examples of the aspects of power and control that are typically associated with the variations of domestic violence as well as some

of the many reasons the victims- men and women- use to justify staying with or not reporting their abuser. Many don't recognize that the abuse is likely to escalate. The presentation showed the escalation from pushing to punching, from punching to slapping, then kicking, throwing objects. Then to strangling and on to use of weapons and sexual and aggravated assault, ultimately ending in death. Not all cases end or progress the same way, but the trends are apparent.

Some victims think it is best for their children if they stay, or simply do not have the resources to take care of them-

selves and/or their children and don't realize that assistance is available both financially and for the physical an emotional damage as show in the excerpts from Detective Miller's presentation.
