time of need.

TIP provides volunteers who can assist with arrangements after traumatic events and emotional first aid. TIP cites its primary reason for existence is to assist in the prevention of what is known as a "Second Injury" to a victim. In traumatic events such as auto accidents, suicides, accidental deaths, or fires; professionals in the emergency response systems are busy dealing with the crisis and simply do not have the time to deal with the victims loved ones, neighbors, or observers.

Although unintentional, the perception of the loved can often be that the response teams are clinical and don't care. They feel uninformed and may not know how

to deal with the aftereffects such as clean up of a scene or where to turn to for funeral arrangements or a place to stay. These fears and lack of support cause the second injury to the survivors and are unnecessary. TIP volunteers are not able to stop the pain of the event, but they can provide direction, compassion and understanding without taking away from the emergency responders ability to respond to the crisis and to avoid the feelings of overwhelming abandonment when the responders leave the scene.

Gabrielle encourages everyone to use the program and spread the word to our associates to avoid unnecessary second injuries and better cope with traumatic incidences. Please find

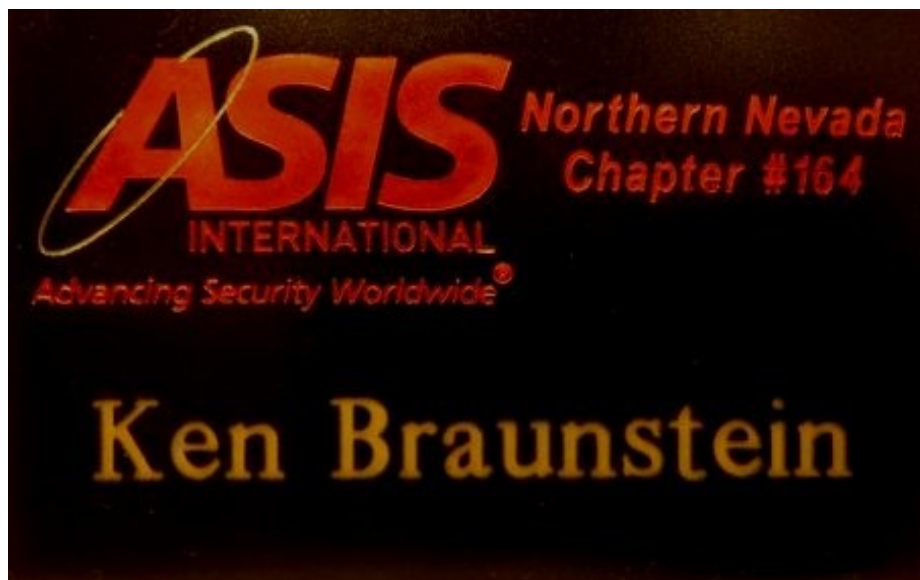
